## KEEPING THEM GORGEOUS

If you stain cashmere or silk, don't rub with water, which will compound the problem. Visit the dry cleaner.

To remove dust or pet hair from a wool or cashmere throw, pop it in the dryer for 15 minutes (no heat).

Be sure stored throws can breathe; plastic enclosures can cause fibers to sweat, which leads to staining. An old, well-washed cotton pillowcase is a good storage sack.
