## 4 WAYS to give an outdoor space a little spice

- 1 Think outside the box** Avoid right angles whenever you can (think of Myles's simple piano curve in the bench seating), and look for furniture that reads lounge, not living room.
- 2 Add a subtle glow** While you might imagine the region's multicolored embroideries and rich ceramics against stark white stucco, Myles recommends making your base paint a little warmer. For instance, she added a tinge of pink (with Behr's Pecos Spice house paint; behr.com) to the couple's original white walls.
- 3 Layer it on** Rugs and pillows in multiples? Check. By also using string curtains, metal wall panels and lush swaths of fabric, the interior designer achieved depth in a décor that's all about embellishment.
- 4 Embrace the elements** Water fountains, fireplaces or a fire pit, potted plants and candlelight contribute to the sensual indoor-outdoor vibe.
